

### School values





## Independence



### Study periods

Sixth Form is **full time**. (There is time for around 10 hours of part time work). 27 hours/3 subjects or 36 hours/4 subjects per fortnight

If you were spending significantly less than the British average of 36.6 hours a week on your school work, research for higher education and enrichment, it could raise interesting questions...

Previous successes doesn't automatically guarantee it for the future

Research suggests students who achieve A grades do 20 hours of independent study a week across 4 subjects/areas.

#### WHY?

- Positive correlation between success and attendance 95-100% - Better than average progress 50-80% - 1 grade lower in 2 out of 3 subjects Lower 50% - 1 grade or more lower than average in <u>ALL</u> subjects
- Lower attendance correlates with more questions missed in exams
- 3. Friendships




