Kudos is an impartial online careers guidance and information program that helps young people plan their future and make informed decisions.

Kudos is ideal for 13-19 year olds. It can make career suggestions based on what you tell it about your interests and educational aspirations. You can then explore these suggestions or look at your own career ideas.

You can add careers and subjects to your own personal Action Plan, where you can set goals and target dates. Up-to-date and accurate detailed information is provided on over 700 different careers (covering over 1,800 job titles).

TOP TIP

Make a note of your username and password so that you can log back into your Kudos session later. Go to <u>www.cascaid.co.uk/kudos</u> and click on **USE**. If you have a username and password, enter it in the *Know your login details?* section.

If your teacher/adviser has given you a licence code, enter it in the *Not signed up yet?* section. You'll then be able to create your own username and password.

<u>Getting started</u>

My Dashboard gives you hints and tips about what you can do in Kudos.

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As you use Kudos you can get more help by looking in the orange information box or by clicking on the *Explain* links.

My likes and dislikes

First, you need to tell Kudos which qualification levels you are aiming to achieve. Kudos will then ask you questions about your likes and dislikes.

You can add your own notes to any careers by clicking on the *Notes* icon.

Improving your career suggestions

Click *My Steps* to see *My Dashboard* and other options.



Answer *More Likes & Dislikes* – this will help to improve your match. Change *My Qualification Level* – see how aiming higher changes your suggestions.

My Subjects – tell Kudos about what you have studied, what you are currently studying and what you are planning to study in the future. You can also add subjects to your favourites.

My Study & Training – tell Kudos your plans.

My Health – enter any health conditions which affect you and Kudos will tell you if there are any issues with your career ideas.

My Suggested Careers – review your careers suggestions at any time.

Explore My Own Career Ideas – search for careers which haven't been suggested for you, get more information and find out why you haven't been matched to them.

My Types of Work – explore which types of work best match your answers.

My Action Plan – create your own plan to help you achieve your goals.


How they can help you


Everyone has the ability and potential to develop and grow in their lives and careers. The National Careers Service understands however that sometimes things get in the way and can hold you back.

The website aims to:


- help you with careers decisions and planning.





What do I get out of it?

With an Apprenticeship you can earn money while you learn the skills you need to succeed. You'll get recognised qualifications, full support during training and enjoy great career prospects at the end.

How do I progress?

An Apprenticeship not only trains you in the skills employers want, it also opens up further career and learning options. You can carry on working, do more advanced training or even go on to higher education.

What do I need to do?

6 Steps to an Apprenticeship...

1 Go to apprenticeships.org.uk

Go to <u>apprenticeships.org.uk</u> then click the Search for vacancies link in the *Apprenticeship Vacancies* box on the home page. Now you are ready to start. On this page you can start searching, or register.

2 Register your details

To register, click the *Register Now* link under *New User?* and fill in your details.

Then create a username and password. Remember to keep your username and password safe.

You'll receive confirmation through your registered email address. You must click on the link in the email to activate your account. This link opens a window to your *My Home* page.

3 Create your Home Page

My Home Page is your own secure space. You can use it to:

- Search for apprenticeship vacancies and save your search results.
- Log your areas of interest: e.g. business administration.
- Manage your applications.
- Set up alerts by email or SMS to inform you when a vacancy is on the system matching your criteria.

4 Search for your match

Search for Apprenticeships that match your interests by

- Occupation/job role
- Employer
- Keyword
- Learning provider e.g a college
- Location/postcode, e.g Bedfordshire

The search engine will find all the Apprenticeships that match your criteria.

5 Browse your results

You can click on any of the listed vacancies for more information. Each listing gives detailed information about the job, including the employer, training, pay and the qualifications you will be working towards.

You can save your search results, so they are easy to access at any time, or start a new search.

6 Manage your future

Once you've found the job you want, applying is easy. The application form is simple, secure and reusable, so you can respond to vacancies and save your application forms.

You can view the status of your applications and manage them online.
